

## **Purposes of Newly Constituted Organizations**

### **Clio**

To orchestrate fun and educational, formal and informal activities that will build a sense of community among history students and professors and promote a better understanding and appreciation of history among the greater Wellesley College community.

To foster positive dialogue between students (majors, minors, and non-majors) and the History department.

### **Tennis Club**

To provide the Wellesley College community with the opportunity to

- c. play tennis for recreational purposes

### **Russian Club**

To provide opportunities for students of Russian and other students interested in Russian culture to attend events both on and off the Wellesley campus related to Russian language and culture.

To provide a fun place to learn and perform traditional Irish, Scottish, and Cape Breton music. To support and promote traditional fiddle music in whatever way [the club] can.

### **Peace Coalition**
