



Wellesley College Study Abroad Application Process for 2010-11

Proposals to Study Away for any time during the 2010-11 academic year (full year, fall or spring) must be received by the Office of International Study by midnight on December 1. The on-line form can be found at <http://www.wellesley.edu/OIS/studyaway.html>.

Once the Proposal to Study Away has been approved, the OIS will send an envelope and **Application Checklist** specific to your preferred program to your campus mailbox. The **Wellesley College Application for Study Abroad** and all other hard copy documents should be submitted to the OIS in the provided envelope by the appropriate deadline:

Dec 1	Oxford and Cambridge
Dec 15	AKP, SIT (Fall)
Feb 1	All other Fall/Year programs, SIT (Spring), other UK (Fall/Spring/Year)
Feb 16	IHRE (Fall), BU (Fall), DIS (Fall) Wellesley Exchanges: Canada, Manchester, Ewha, Sciences Po, Hong Kong
April 15	BU (Spring), All other programs (Spring)

Applications for ECCO & Aix should be submitted to the OIS by February 16. Applications for PRESHCO & PMCSP should be submitted to the Spanish Department, Wellesley-in-Vienna applications to the German Department and JWU applications to EALL all per each department's specific deadlines.

Students may **apply to only one program at a time**. Most Wellesley students who meet the minimum criteria for their program and apply well before the deadline are accepted to their first choice. In some cases, a backup application may be warranted. Students who do not meet their preferred program's criteria, are applying late, or are applying to a program that is very selective should check with the OIS director.

Please note:

- ✚ If your application asks how your fees will be paid, please indicate that the OIS should be billed for your tuition and that you should be billed for room, board and any other non-tuition expenses.
- ✚ It is your responsibility to pay any application fees, and you must submit payment with your application.
- ✚ Applications for most programs are available on their web sites.
- ✚ If you are applying to a non-approved program, to study abroad in more than one destination or in a country with a State Department Travel Warning, you must submit a **petition by January 30**.
