



CAMPUS CRIME ALERT

This is a Campus Security Notice intended for members of the Wellesley College community. Please help us distribute this information by emailing this notice to friends and colleagues or by posting it on bulletin boards located throughout the campus.

On Monday, December 6, 2004, between 12:00 PM and 3:00 PM, two overhead projectors were stolen from the Science Center. One projector was stolen from Room 155, located adjacent to the Green Houses. The second projector was stolen from Room 277, the large auditorium located near the Sage entrance.

Several witnesses observed the suspect in the Science Center and a reporting party observed one of the projectors being placed in a motor vehicle in Dower Lot.

The suspect is described as a white male, 30-40 years old, 5'6"- 5'8", 130-140 lbs, with small thin build. The individual was also described with a sunken face and disheveled appearance. One of the witnesses also thought the subject was toothless. Suspect was wearing a gray sweatshirt or a greenish gray jacket, blue pants or jeans and a dark knit cap.

At approximately 3:00 PM, in Dower Lot, the suspect met a black male operating an older model, black Nissan type vehicle. No description on the black male was available. Both individuals were seen exiting the campus together driving toward route 135.

Anyone with any information regarding this incident should immediately contact Campus Police at extension 2121.

2. Lock your room or office, even if you are just running down the hall. Many larcenies from College rooms or offices occur when the owner of the property leaves the room for just a few minutes.

4. If you see a person or witness activity that you consider suspicious, trust your instincts and call us immediately at x5555 or use a Blue Light emergency phone.
5. Wallets, pocketbooks and laptop computers are easy targets. Make sure they are with you at all times.
6. Participate in **Operation Identification** to have your valuables engraved so that in the event that your valuables are lost or stolen, they could be recovered.
7. Keep your personal keys with you at all times to avoid somebody making copies.
