



CAMPUS CRIME ALERT

This is a follow-up Campus Security Notice intended for members of the Wellesley College community. Please help us distribute this information by e-mailing this notice to friends and colleagues or by posting it on bulletin boards located throughout the campus.

On Sunday, October 31, 1999, the Town of Wellesley Police began investigating a homicide that occurred in the area of Morses Pond, in the Town of Wellesley. On Tuesday, February 29, 2000, the Town of Wellesley Police arrested a suspect and charged him with the murder.

As a result of this arrest and continuous consultation with the Town of Wellesley Police, Wellesley College has elected to eliminate the extra police staffing that has been in effect since the beginning of this investigation.

Although an arrest has been made in this incident, we continue to encourage community members to follow these important crime prevention tips:

Please take time to review these important safety and security tips:

1. Whenever possible, travel to your destination with a friend.
2. Use the Campus Escort Program.
3. If you expect to be away from your residence for an extended period of time, always tell a friend or roommate where you will be and when you will return.
4. Always walk or run in well-lighted areas.
5. Use regular travel paths; do not cut through dense wooded areas.
6. If you see anything suspicious or out of the ordinary, contact the Campus Police Department by calling ext. 5555, or by using an emergency call box.
